ABOUT THE FUND



They typically maintain a moderate duration of up to 2 years and invests in well researched credits / structures for yield enhancement. The fund looks for opportunities in the fixed income segment across varying interest rates cycle. Investing in such funds aims to give investors the benefit of generating income in both rising and falling interest rate environment. The fund has adequate exposure towards AAA bonds, G-Sec & money market instruments for ensuring liquidity


- RBI in its MPC of Feb 2025 has cut the repo rate by 25bps for the first time in 5 years. The cut was delivered with 6-0 vote, while maintaining the stance neutral
- The Benchmark yield rose by 5-7bps after the policy as MPC delayed the new norms of LCR by one more year that would have forced banks to buy extra Government securities but would have impacted negatively on banks' credit growth
- India's credit growth remained stagnant at around 11% for the past three month. However, the pace of credit growth has significantly slowed down from last two years.
- Pressure remained with deposit growth as well, the deposit growth increased to 10.6% in Feb-25 compared to 9.8% last month, but similar to the levels of Feb 2023
- As mandated, we remain invested more than 56% in good quality AA and below AA assets. We have added new assets during the month to enhance the yield of the portfolio
- We have allocated small amount REITS and INVITS to enhance the potential return of the fund
- We intend to maintain Average duration between 2.00 2.75 years.
- The scheme remains open to tactical duration calls



RATING ALLOCATION TREND (% of Net Assets)




MACAULAY DURATION (In years)







