- The scheme intends to seek long term capital growth by investing in equity and equity related securities, debt & money market instruments, REITs / InVITs and Gold ETF
- The scheme intends to give access to multiple asset classes, which saves the hassle of investing, tracking and maintaining investments in multiple strategies / funds

a. Investing in Equities aim to provide Capital Appreciation, build wealth in the long term and helps to meet long term financial goals of an investor.

b.Investing in fixed income asset class aims to help with income generation and help to mitigate the volaility of the equity market by diversifying in fixed income instrument


c.Gold is an international asset class and may help with growth in the long run. It is used to hedge against inflation and the adverse impact of geo-political events

• Due to the unique characteristics of each asset class, each of them is suited for a different but complementary role in the portfolio.


PORTFOLIO POSITIONING

- Over the past 1 year, Gold has outperformed equity massively surging 37% in INR terms. In the past 1 month as well, gold delivered a return of -6%. This was aided by the depreciation of the INR versus the US dollar. This appreciation in gold prices has resulted in gold being marginally ahead of our usual 14-16% allocation on the multi-asset product at a little over 16%.
- Our near term preference for large caps is reflected here as well with ~82% of the equity exposure in large caps. The relative outperformance of gold and fixed income versus equity has resulted in equity exposures being now placed at 69% (~100bps lower than the levels of the prior month)
- Over the course of the month, we added to weights on financials (largely private banks) and consumer staples. This was funded by trimming exposures on consumer discretionary and industrials. We are marginally overweight dollar beneficiaries like IT here while we have reduced our underweight on financials given the change in RBI stance to Neutral.

- Gold prices have reached an all-time high of \$2,950 per ounce as a safe haven product against all the tariff war and uncertainty over a very volatile
- Uncertainty over U.S. tariffs globally are causing the uptick in DXY, INR witnessed deprecation pressure on account of strong DXY
- RBI in its MPC of Feb 2025 has cut the reporate by 25bps for the first time in 5 years, as expected in our view.. The cut was delivered with 6-0 vote, while maintaining the stance neutral
- RBI's forward guidance and the rate cut gives us confidence on growth supported future policy expectations
- Crude is under selling pressure as OPEC+ is planning to increase the output.
- We have allocated a small amount in AAA REITS and INVITS with an intention to generate alpha over debt returns from a medium-term perspective.
- The scheme invested in short-to-medium-term corporate bonds and G-sec of various tenors while maintaining the duration of 2.25-3.25 according to current interest rates view.
- The scheme remains open to taking tactical duration calls




CURRENT ASSET ALLOCATION (% of Net Assets) CURRENT MARKET CAP (% of Net Assets)





Concept of Macaulay duration - The Macaulay Duration is a measure of a bond's sensitivity to interest rate changes. It is expressed in annual terms. It is the weighted average term to maturity of the cash flows from a bond. The weight of each cash flow is determined by dividing the present value of the cash flow by the price. Factors like a bond's price, maturity, coupon, yield to maturity among others impact the calculation of Macaulay duration. The Macaulay duration can be viewed as the economic balance point of a group of cash flows. Another way to interpret the statistic is that it is the weighted average number of years an investor must maintain a position in the bond until the present value of the bond's cash flows equals the amount paid for the bond.
